On behalf of Global Footprint Network and the University of Siena Ecodynamics Group, I am writing to formally invite you to be a participant at <u>Footprint Forum 2010 – Meet the Winners of the 21st Century</u>, to be held June 7-10 in Colle di Val d'Elsa, Italy, just outside Siena.

In this highly interactive Forum, we will explore opportunities for advancing sustainability in the post-Copenhagen world. Given the persistent challenge of reaching meaningful international agreements, there has never been a greater need for governments to recognize their self-interest in preparing for a future with tightening resource constraints. We are certain that you will reap valuable insights and make new connections among peers from other regions, which will help you advance your work.

This is not a forum to rehash old thinking or traditional strategies; rather, it is designed to move our sustainability work to the next level of effectiveness and scale. For this reason, we believe this forum might be critical to your work.
